
Performance Notes for "Lids"

A & B cans should be 30 gallon aluminum/metal type. Players will be playing on the "lids" end and it would be advisable to remove the handles for the ease of execution. Use marching sticks for best sound results. Cans A & B should, at least, be doubled and for every addition of two bodies on the metal cans, add one bass can. The best set-up would be to alternate the metal can line between the A & B players and put the bass cans on an end or behind the metal cans.

The **bass can** should be the large rubber type, turned upside-down and played on the bottom. You will not need the lid for the bass can(s). Take two "brico" blocks and place the can on them to allow sound to resonate from the bottom of the can. For best sound results, use a medium pair of felt bass drum mallets.

Bars 60-67 may be performed with the players clicking their own sticks throughout if they are having trouble executing clicking their neighbor's sticks.

The accelerandos from "F' to "G" and bar 111 to the end may be augmented if so desired.
