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Introduction

As a kid, the majority of us, (at least my age \odot), would put together cardboard boxes in the shape of a drum set and play them as if they were a real drum set. I would play along to The Beatles, Elvis Presley and many others. The boxes would not last very long, but were still fun to play.

I did not own my very first drum set until my sophomore year in college. It wasn't until my college jazz band director offered me a gig with his band that I was able to afford a new drum set. I played in his big band along with many other groups such as small jazz groups, symphonies, wedding bands, and Tejano bands. Those were some great experiences, especially playing such a variety of musical genres.

There were several times that I was asked to perform a solo either within a song, before a song started, or as a segue to a different part of a song. Needless to say, I was pretty nervous performg a solo since I had no previous experience in creating one (except on timbales). If the song had been previously recorded, I would go to the library and listen to the original drummer on the song and try and copy, note-for-note, what they played. I mean I listened to it over and over. Even then, I was still nervous, but not as much if I had not done my research.

There is no escaping the importance of studying the great drummers of each musical style. This by far (with some possible guidance from a teacher) is the best way to not only learn styles of music, but to also learn how solos are structured and performed. These days, students can spend hours upon hours watching YouTube videos of the master drummers. I would have loved to have had that resource while growing up learning the drum set.

That being said, *Bugadafish*, is a collection of 15 easy to intermediate drum set solos for the beginning drum set performer. *Bugadafish* (Bucket of Fish) gets its name from the sound a drummer plays on the drum set after someone tells a joke or something funny. Each solo comes with a unique play-along track which is available as a download off of the *Bugadafish* page at www.rowloff.com. It is important to note that the solos can be performed with or without the accompaniment.

The solos are fun and can be performed in a drum set class setting or on an individual basis. I have titled the solos after famous drum set players, both past and present. The solos, however, **are not** in the style of those players. I titled the solos in this manner so that the student can at least know who the drummers are and take it upon themselves to find them on the internet and study them carefully. There is a brief Wikipedia description (at the end of the book) of each of those famous drummers. Learn as much as you can from listening, because, as I have said before, listening to the greats is the best way to learn great drumming.
