**Pit:** Measures 6-8 rest. Measure 9 starts with a sixteenth-note pattern followed by eighth-note patterns. Measure 10 ends with eighth-note patterns.

**Tuba:** Measures 6-8 play eighth-note patterns. Measure 9 starts with a sixteenth-note "cowbell" pattern followed by eighth-note patterns. Measure 10 ends with eighth-note patterns.

**Vocal:** Measures 6-8 rest. Measure 9 rests. Measure 10 rests.

Measure numbers 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 are indicated above the staves. Dynamic markings include *mf*, *hi-hat*, *hi-hat at snares*, *f*, and *mf*.
